SOCKTOBER SHOOTOUT: HOW TO PLAY

The Socktober Shootout

- Students can wear their favourite team's jersey or socks and kick goals for kids in need around the world.
- Each student has five shots at goal, penalty shootout-style, and can be sponsored by friends and family for each attempt.
- One goal attempt will be played with the sockball made by students, helping to shape an understanding of soccer in developing countries.
- The goalkeeper is an integral part of the game and can join in the fun to 'save' goals. Invite your school principal, REC, parish priest, mayor or local soccer star to be your goalkeeper.
- The positioning of the student to the goals will be dependent upon age group. Three positions suggested: Infants (five metres), Primary (seven metres) and secondary students (ten metres).
- Timing it takes approximately 20-30 minutes to play for a class of 25 students (see suggested set-up below).

What you need:

- Access to an oval or courts
- Equipment:
 - o 16 soccer balls
 - o Four hand-made 'sockballs' made by children prior to the day (see How to Make a Sockball)
 - o Four soccer nets or goal markers (cones, sports sticks etc.)
