- Read Pope Francis' quote above. How is this reflected in your school? Where do you see it reflected in sports clubs and associations?
- Identify and research three examples of athletes displaying the true spirit of sport.
- Identify the six principles of Sport at the Service of Humanity.
 Where do these appear in your favourite sport or game?

KEY: Goals for this Mission Pack



- Read the scripture from Phillipians 2:3. What are we being asked to do when we put the needs of others first? How does this relate to sport?
- Read about Pope Francis' experience as a boy playing soccer in Buenos Aires. How does this connect him to children around the world, like in Thailand?
- Write about a time when you were a good sport. Write about a time when someone was a good sport to you.

- What's your favourite sport or game? Teach a sibling or friend how to play the game.
- Invite your family to join you in a game of soccer, and teach them a skill you've learnt during Socktober. If you have made one, use your sockball!
- Share your Socktober Star page with friends and family and ask them to pledge a sponsorship for the goals you will kick on your event day. Don't have a page? Create one today and tell your story at socktober.org.au.

Scripture Reflection:

Philippians 2:3

"Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves."

Additional Activities

Primary

- Pope Francis said football teaches three lessons that can promote peace and solidarity around the world: the need to train and work hard to reach goals; the importance of fair play and teamwork; and the need to respect and honour opponents. Have you experienced or seen examples of this?
- What is the motto of the Olympic Games? What do these words encourage athletes to do? Does your school have a motto? How do you see it lived each day in your community?
- Is the motto of the Paralympics the same as the Olympic Games? Research someone who is a Paralympian and write five key parts of their story.
- Read about the Special Olympics and the impact this has on the lives of those involved.
- Visit the Sport at the Service of Humanity website and read about the Declaration of Principles. Can you recall examples of how these have been reflected in the global and national sporting events? What about examples in your own lived experience?
- In 1868 a team of Australians travelled overseas to England. Who was this team and what sport did they play?
- With your family, listen to Nelson Mandela's speech at the Laureus Awards for Sport, 'Sport has the power to change the world'. Do you all agree with this statement? Explain your responses.

- Watch the Invictus trailer What were Mandela's goals for South Africa? How did he lead by example? How did sport unite the people of South Africa?
- List all the sports you know. Would you include dance? If not, why? Ask your friends and family their response.
- 'Australians have a win-at-all-costs approach to sport.' Suggest this as a debate/discussion topic for your class. Discuss this with your family - what are their thoughts on this statement?
- Who is your favourite sports star? What qualities
 do they have that you admire? You work for a
 Junior Sports Magazine and have been asked to
 interview your peers and ask them the questions
 above. You can add extra questions if you'd like.
 Find a creative way to share your interviews.
- Does your favourite team have a song?
 What do the words mean?
- Invite your friends to bring their sockballs at play time. Challenge each other and see who can do the most knee ups and can juggle it the longest on their foot or knee.
- What games do your Preps/Kindies like to play?
 Survey the Prep/Kindy classes to find out. What games do you think the children at the Good
 Shepherd Sisters Kindergarten like to play?

Secondary
