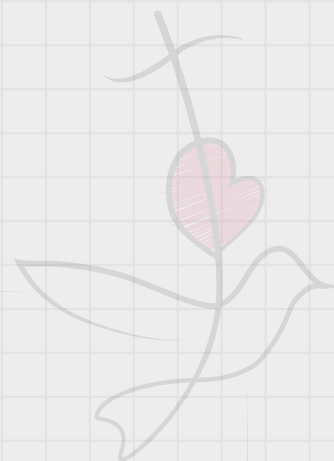

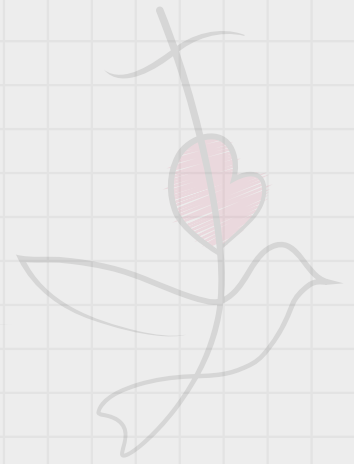

INTRODUCING MALAWI

STUDENT: The wisdom and love of God are beyond our imagination. God's goodness is a gift we treasure. Through God's Spirit, He continually opens our hearts and minds to new ways of connecting with one another, sharing our stories, and recognising our place in God's global family. Today, we carry in our hearts the stories, hopes, and people of **MALAWI**.

Welcome to our liturgy for **WORLD MISSION MONTH 2026**. This year, as we celebrate the centenary of World Mission Sunday, we gather around the theme "**ONE IN CHRIST, UNITED IN MISSION**."

Today we celebrate the people of Malawi, honouring the unique gifts they share with the world. May this celebration inspire us to recognise that we are truly one in Christ, united in mission, bringing hope to our world through our prayers, actions, and care for one another.

Let us create our sacred space.

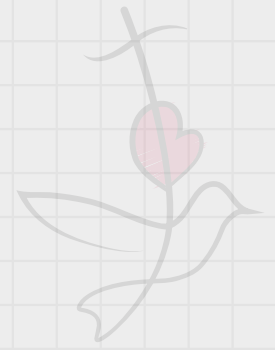
STUDENT: We will now create our space for today's liturgy, centred on Malawi. As we bring forward each item, we invite you to reflect on the faith, culture, and daily life of the people of Malawi. Through their stories, symbols, and strength, we are reminded of how God's love is lived out across the world - especially in places that may seem far from our own.

Each item placed in the space represents a part of Malawi's spirit - its people, its land, and its hope.

STUDENT: We bring forward a picture of St Matthew's located in the Chikwawa diocese. It is a special church and serves as a sign of hope throughout the region. Here, many people come together to pray and it is filled with love and joy. This reminds us that God is with us everywhere - even in faraway or quiet places.

The image is placed in the sacred space.

STUDENT: We bring forward a basket of maize (we might know it as corn here in Australia) - a gift from the earth. In the Diocese of Chikwawa, maize is a food that comes from working closely with the land and with one another. It reminds us to always praise God for all of creation as God calls us to live with gratitude, simplicity, and care for our common home.

The maize is placed in the sacred space.

STUDENT: We bring forward this exercise book, a simple but powerful symbol that every child deserves the opportunity to learn. For many children in Malawi, going to school is not easy. Long distances, poverty, and a lack of classrooms can make education difficult to access. This exercise book reminds us that learning brings hope, opens doors to the future, and helps children discover the gifts God has given them.

The book is placed in the sacred space.

STUDENT: We bring forward this bowl of earth, representing the land on which families and communities in Malawi live, work, and grow. The earth provides food, supports livelihoods, and is a precious gift from God. Yet this same land is vulnerable. Severe droughts can leave the soil dry and cracked, while floods and cyclones can wash away crops, homes, and precious topsoil in a matter of hours, making life incredibly difficult for many families. This bowl of earth reminds us of both the beauty and the fragility of creation.

The bowl is placed in the sacred space.

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STUDENT: We bring forward this bowl of water, reminding us that every person deserves the dignity of clean, safe water. In Malawi, many families and children walk long distances each day to collect water for drinking, cooking, and washing. Water is God's gift of life, bringing health, hope, and the opportunity to flourish. As we place this bowl in our sacred space, may it remind us to give thanks for the blessings we often take for granted, to care for God's creation, and to pray for all those who continue to face the daily challenge of accessing this precious gift.

The bowl of water is placed in the sacred space.

STUDENT: We bring forward the flag of Malawi. Its black stripe represents the people of Malawi, the red symbolises the sacrifices made for the nation's freedom, and the green reflects the country's rich natural beauty and fertile land. The rising red sun represents the dawn of hope, freedom, and the promise of a bright future for the people of Malawi.

The flag is placed in the sacred space.

STUDENT: Students are now invited to place their school candles or banners around the sacred space. The candle reflects the light of Christ, present in all cultures and communities – we are “One in Christ, united in Mission”.

Candles and banners are placed in the space.

STUDENT: May we open our hearts to learn more about the missionary work of the Church in Malawi, drawing inspiration from the remarkable creativity, resilience, and hope of the Malawi people. As we stand in solidarity with them in both their joys and their struggles. Let us take a moment to reflect.

STUDENT: We now invite you to stand for our gathering song.

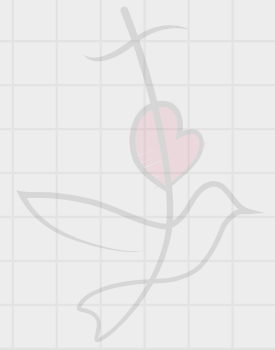

ALL: Lord, have mercy.

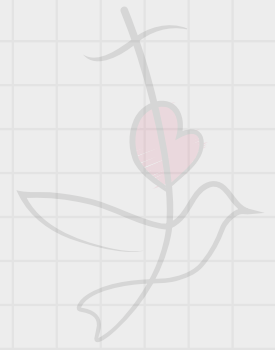
PRESIDER: May our loving God, who is rich in mercy, forgive us, renew our hearts, and lead us to everlasting peace.

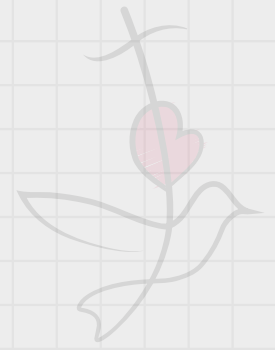

PRESIDER: The Lord be with you.

PRESIDER: A reading from the Gospel according to Matthew

ALL: Glory to you O Lord

PRESIDER: When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain; and after he sat down, his disciples came to him.

Then he began to speak, and taught them, saying:

"Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

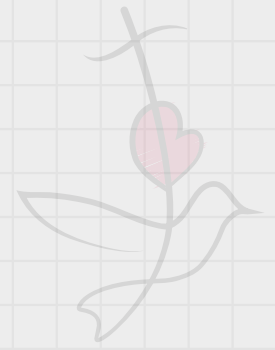

PRESIDER: We now place our petition to our gracious God.

STUDENT: We pray for our Church... may she continue to be a light of hope and unity.
Lord hear us.

ALL: Lord, hear our prayer.

STUDENT: We pray for leaders around the world, that they govern with justice and mercy.
Lord hear us.

ALL: Lord, hear our prayer.

STUDENT: We pray for the people of Malawi, especially those in rural communities without food or water. May we respond in love.
Lord hear us.

ALL: Lord, hear our prayer.

STUDENT: We pray for all who work in mission - especially those walking alongside children and families in Malawi.
Lord hear us.

ALL: Lord, hear our prayer.

STUDENT: We pray for each of us, that we live simply, love deeply, and walk humbly with God, one in Christ, united in mission.
Lord hear us.

ALL: Lord, hear our prayer.

STUDENT: Loving and Merciful God,

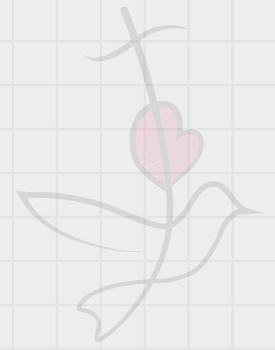

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LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

Please remain seated.

The gifts and bread and wine are brought forward.

Suggested song: Table Song - Kevin Bates

PRESIDER: Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation, for through your goodness we have received the bread we offer you: fruit of the earth and work of human hands, it will become for us the bread of life.

ALL: Blessed be God forever

The Presider then places the paten with the bread on the corporal. The wine and a little water are poured into the chalice, saying quietly:

PRESIDER: By the mystery of this water and wine may we come to share in the divinity of Christ who humbled himself to share in our humanity.

Taking the chalice and holding it slightly above the altar, Presider says inaudibly:

PRESIDER: Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation, for through your goodness we have received the wine we offer you: fruit of the vine and work of human hands, it will become our spiritual drink.

ALL: Blessed be God forever

Then the Presider places the chalice on the corporal.
The Presider bows and says inaudibly:

PRESIDER: With humble spirit and contrite heart may we be accepted by you, O Lord, and may our sacrifice in your sight this day be pleasing to you, Lord God.

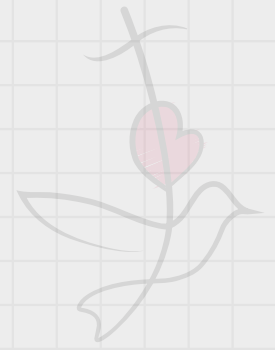
The Presider washes his hands, saying inaudibly:

PRESIDER: Wash me, O Lord, from my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin.

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PRAYER OVER THE OFFERINGS

Please stand.

PRESIDER: Pray, my brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father.

ALL: May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church.

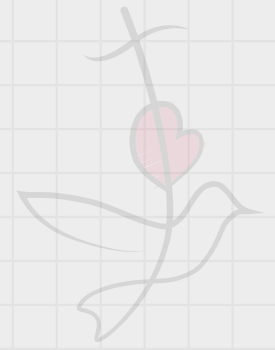
PRESIDER: Loving Creator look upon the face of your Church, so that through him, from the rising of the sun to its setting, your name may be exalted among the nations, and in every place a single offering may be presented to you. Through Christ our Lord.

ALL: Amen

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EUCCHARISTIC PRAYER FOR CHILDREN

PRESIDER: The Lord be with you.

ALL: And with your Spirit.

PRESIDER: Lift up your hearts.

ALL: We lift them up to the Lord.

PRESIDER: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

ALL: It is right and just. (Clap three times)

The Presider, with hands extended, continues the Preface.

PRESIDER: God our Father, you have brought us here together so that we can give you thanks and praise for all the wonderful things you have done. We thank you for all that is beautiful in the world and for the happiness you have given us. We praise you for daylight and for your word which lights up our minds. We praise you for the earth, and all the people who live on it, and for our life which comes from you. We know that you are good. You love us and do great things for us.

The Presider, with hands extended, says:

PRESIDER: Loving God, you are always thinking about your people; you never forget us. You sent us your Son Jesus who gave his life for us and who came to save us. He cured sick people; He cared for those who were poor and wept for those who were sad. He forgave sinners and taught us to forgive each other. He loved everyone and showed us how to be kind. He took children in his arms and blessed them.

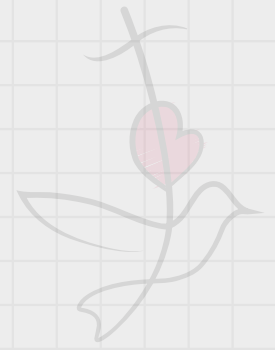
The Presider, with hands extended, continues:

PRESIDER: Creator God, all over the world your people praise you. So now we pray with the whole Church: with Leo our Pope and me, your unworthy servant. In heaven the blessed Virgin Mary, the Apostles and all the Saints always sing your praise. Now we join with them and with the Angels to adore you as we sing:

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EUCCHARISTIC PRAYER FOR CHILDREN

ALL: Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full, full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord Hosanna in the highest.

The Presider, with hands extended, continues:

PRESIDER: God our Father, you are most holy, and we want to show you that we are grateful. We bring you bread and wine

The Presider joins his hands and, holding them extended over the offerings, says:

PRESIDER: And ask you to send your Holy Spirit to make these gifts

He joins hands and makes the Sign of the Cross once over the bread and chalice together, saying:

PRESIDER: The body and blood of Jesus your Son.

The Presider joins his hands.

PRESIDER: Then we can offer to you what you have given for us. On the night before he died, Jesus was having supper with his Apostles.

The Presider takes the bread and, holding it slightly raised above the altar, continues:

PRESIDER: He took bread from the table.
He gave you thanks and praise.
Then he broke the bread, gave it to his friends and said:

He bows slightly.

PRESIDER: Take this, all of you and eat of it:
for this is my body
which will be given up for you.

The Presider shows the consecrated host to the people, places it again on the paten, and genuflects in adoration.

After this, he continues:

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EUCCHARISTIC PRAYER FOR CHILDREN

PRESIDER: When supper was ended,

The Presider takes the chalice and, holding it slightly raised above the altar, continues:

PRESIDER: Jesus took the cup that was filled with wine. He thanked you, gave it to his friends and said: take this, all of you, and drink from it: this is the cup of my blood, the blood of the new and eternal covenant, which will be poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Then he said to them: do this in memory of me.

He shows the chalice to the people, places it on the corporal, and genuflects in adoration.

Then, with hands extended, the Presider says:

PRESIDER: We do now what Jesus told us to do. We remember his death and his resurrection, and we offer you, loving God, the bread that gives us life, and the cup that saves us. Jesus brings us to you; Welcome us as you welcome him. Let us proclaim our faith:

ALL: When we eat this bread and drink this cup
We proclaim your death O Lord,
Until you come again.

Then the Presider, with hands extended, says:

PRESIDER: Father, because you love us, you invite us to come to your table. Fill us with the joy of the Holy Spirit as we receive the body and blood of your Son.

Lord, you never forget any of your children. We ask you to take care of those we love, and we pray for those who have died.

Remember everyone who is suffering from pain or sorrow. Remember Christians everywhere and all other people in the world. We are filled with wonder and praise when we see what you do for us through Jesus your Son, and so we give you praise.

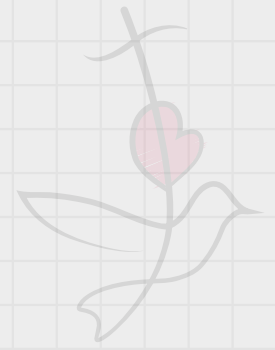
Through him, and with him, and in him, O God almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honour is yours, almighty Father, forever, and ever.

ALL: Amen

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COMMUNION RITE

PRESIDER: At the Saviour's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say:

ALL: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil.

PRESIDER: Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant peace in our days, that, by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from all distress, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ.

The Presider joins his hands, and the people conclude the prayer, saying:

ALL: For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours now and for ever.

PRESIDER: Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your Apostles: Peace, I leave you, my peace I give you, look not on our sins, but on the faith of your Church, and graciously grant her peace and unity in accordance with your will. Who live and reign for ever and ever.

ALL: Amen

The Presider extends and then joins his hands, and continues:

PRESIDER: The peace of the Lord be with you always.

ALL: And with your spirit.

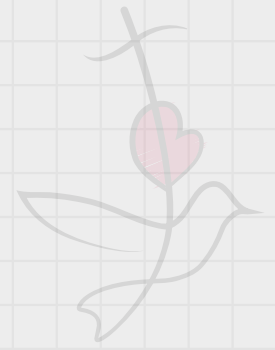
PRESIDER: Let us offer each other the sign of peace.

The assembly exchanges a sign of peace. The Presider then takes the host, breaks it over the paten, and places a small piece in the chalice, saying quietly:

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PRESIDER: May this mingling of the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ bring eternal life to us who receive it.

ALL: Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world,
have mercy on us.
Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world,
have mercy on us.
Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world,
grant us peace.

The Presider, with hands joined, continues inaudibly:

PRESIDER: May the receiving of your Body and Blood, Lord Jesus Christ, not bring me to judgement and condemnation, but through your loving mercy be for me protection in mind and body and a healing remedy.

The Presider genuflects, takes the host and, holding it slightly raised above the paten or above the chalice, while facing the people, says aloud:

PRESIDER: Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.

ALL: Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.

The Presider, facing the altar, says quietly:

PRESIDER: May the Body of Christ keep me safe for eternal life.

And he reverently consumes the Body of Christ. Then he takes the chalice and says quietly:

PRESIDER: May the Blood of Christ keep me safe for eternal life.

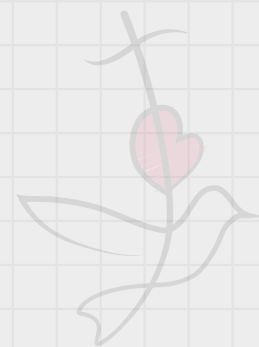
And he reverently consumes the Blood of Christ.

The Communion hymn begins as the Presider receives the Body of Christ and continues as needed for the duration of the Communion Procession.

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PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION

Please stand.

PRESIDER: Let us pray.
Humbly we ask you, Almighty God, be graciously pleased to grant
that those you renew with your Sacraments may also serve lives
pleasing to you.
Through Christ our Lord.

ALL: Amen.

CONCLUDING RITES

GREETING

PRESIDER: The Lord be with you.

ALL: And with your spirit.

SOLEMN BLESSING

PRESIDER: Bow your heads and pray for Christ's blessing.
In Christ, God has revealed God's love and God's truth.
May God, make you witnesses to the Gospel and to the divine love.

ALL: Amen.

PRESIDER: The Lord Jesus promised to be with his Church until the end of the
world. May he give power to your actions and your words.

ALL: Amen.

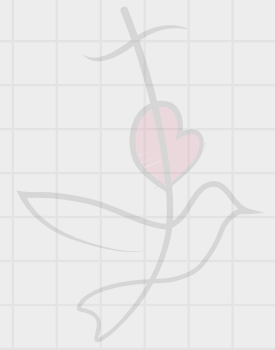
PRESIDER: May the Spirit of the Lord be with you, so that you may go through
